75th ANNIVERSARY of D-DAY June 6th, 2019 marks the start of the 75th anniversary of D-Day Landings and the Battle of Normandy. USA, Canadian and British Flags will be flown around Briny Fountain. A momentous occasion to celebrate peace, liberty and reconciliation.

AMERICAN FLAG BIRTHDAY - 243 Years Old June 14th, commonly called Flag Day, marks the 243rd Birthday of our American Flag. Briny will honor the day by flying three uniquely American Flags. On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress replaced the British symbols of the "Grand Union Flag" with a newly designed "Betsy Ross Flag". Although it is not certain, this flag is thought to have been made by the Philadelphia seamstress Betsy Ross, who was an official flag maker for the Pennsylvania Navy.
